Principal's Message

Over the past 4 weeks we have trialled a different format for our newsletter using a full page rather than columns. As you can see today we have gone back to our column format. The calendar will now be on the back page of the newsletter.

At Wirreanda PS the teachers and I work very hard to make the children independent and responsible for their learning and their behaviour. The Kindergarten children are now well settled into routines and have a good understanding of their responsibilities. It is asked that parents drop off their children and leave as the bell goes at 9.20am at the latest.

Of an afternoon, parents are asked to stay well clear of the COLA and any area past the admin entrance, waiting on the grassed area in front of the school or the NOLA.

Every Day Counts!

Going to school every day is a vital part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind. Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

It's not justifiable to keep your child away from school for: their birthday, shopping, visiting family and friends, a hot/or cold day, if they sleep in, minor check ups or care such as hair cuts.

The importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day

- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and **parents must sign child/ren in at the office**, even if your child is only 5 minutes late.

Our **3 Way Conferences** are in Week 8 this term. Last year we introduced this form of parent-child-teacher communication to establish and build upon positive home-school partnerships with a focus on goal setting. Teachers will also discuss and gather information to assist in supporting your child as well as sharing observational information about how your child has settled in and commenced the new year of schooling.

Have a wonderful fortnight.

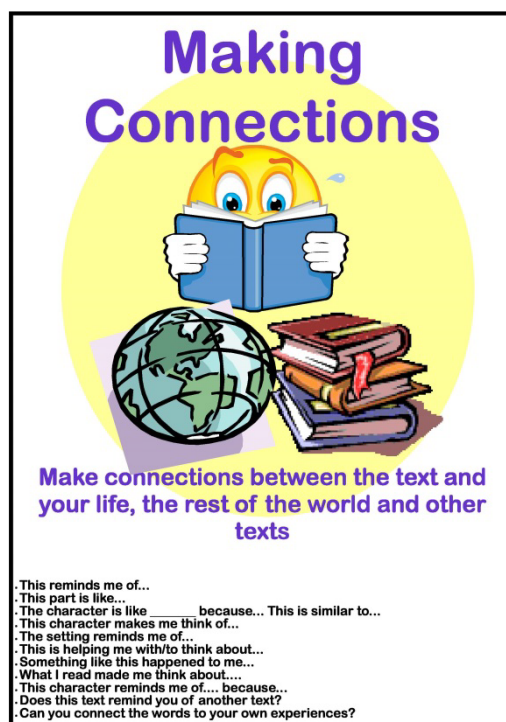

Gifted and Talented Students (GATS)

Focus on Reading

This week's information is on how good readers make personal connections with what they are reading to develop a deeper understanding.

Sizzling Starts

Across the school classrooms have been focusing on writing Sizzling Starts, one of the 7 Steps to Writing Success. Writing a Sizzling Start is about engaging the reader and making them want to keep reading. There are a number of techniques good writers use to write a Sizzling Start.

1. Start with action.

Five, four, three, two, ONE! The cameras were rolling and I was about to eat a cockroach.

2. Make the reader curious.

3. Create a 'Moment of Change'.

4. Use humour.

Ever cheered for your footy team with a pie in one hand and a drink in the other? Don't. When that final goal happened, I wore both.

5. Dialogue brings characters to life.

The *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey Years 4 ,5, 6 Only

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many others in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey aims to help improve student learning outcomes and measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide our school with valuable and quick

feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help improve how they do things at school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential and school staff will not be able to identify individual students from their responses. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 14th March and 8th April. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and a list of frequently asked questions (FAQs) for parents/carers about the survey is being sent home with this newsletter.

If you **do not** want your child or children to participate, please return the consent form to school by **Monday 7th March**. The FAQs and copies of the consent form, including translated consent forms, are available from the website above.



On Friday, 4th March the school will be participating in the 26th annual Clean Up Australia Day. We encourage all students to get involved and it would be appreciated if they could bring a pair of gloves to school on this day.

Prior to participating in this activity the students will be given direction with regards to safe practices whilst cleaning the school grounds. The students will be supervised at all times by their class teacher. This year Stage 3 (years 5 & 6) will be cleaning the footpaths around the edge of the school.

If your child is in Stage 3 and you do not want your child outside the school grounds you need to advise their teacher so other arrangements can be made.

As part of Clean Up Australia Day this year we are also making it a bin less day. We ask student's to bring their lunch etc. in reusable containers, not wrapped in plastic wrap which will reduce the amount of waste generated on this day. We appreciate parent's support in this endeavour.

Great news, the Child Dental Benefits Schedule continues in 2016! The Commonwealth Government dental scheme provides eligible children with a \$1000 free kids dental benefit* on selected dental services within a 2 year calendar period.

To gain access to benefits, children must be eligible for Medicare, must be between 2 and 17 years of age for at least 1 day of the calendar year with the child or parent, guardian or carer receiving Family Tax Benefit Part A or another relevant government payment.

***Tell Them From Me* student survey:
Information and consent form for
parents and carers Years 4, 5, 6 only.**

Dear Parents and Carers

In Term 1 2016, your school is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed on-line and is run by an independent research company, **The Learning Bar**, which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will **not** be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will be suppressed. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

As well as schools getting student feedback, the Department of Education, through the Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE), has access to data from across NSW and is running a research project to look at state-wide patterns of student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The research is looking at how these things impact on student outcomes, including academic performance. Individual students and schools will **not** be identified in any CESE publications, and all information will be handled in accordance with the relevant privacy legislation. Students' personal information will not be disclosed by the Department to any other person or body other than as required by law.

This research will help schools in New South Wales to better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will also help teachers and principals discuss what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable answering any question, he/she should leave it blank and move on to the next question. Your child can stop the survey at any time.

If you **do not want your child to take part** in the survey, please complete the attached form and return it to your child's school by **Monday, 7th March**.
